3. Information Items

a) President's Report: Natalya Nicholson

- Anthem property project approved with no appeals
- Rocky will come with update on what's coming
- Talisman centre update – they've received plans from design firm
 - Entry way faces more SE towards current C-train station
 - 1 main entrance, front desk will be there
 - Fieldhouse wraps around West of building (in green space b/w existing sidewalk and building)
 - Discussion on how that imposes on green space in Lindsay Park and current site
 - Still waiting on formal presentation from Jeff Booke at Talisman and can discuss further then

b) Vice-President's Report: No report

d) Directors Reports

i. Membership:

- 136 members
- Soliciting local businesses for perks for community members
- Formalized package to come with benefits

ii. Post-flood Action Committee: Geoff Granville

- Process for mitigation moving very slowly
- Springbank going slowly, not sure if surveyors are on the land

iii. Parks:

- River cleanup – May 1st

- Krista spearheading refreshments – smaller than previous years, but there may be more options with the talks that Danielle is having with local businesses
- iv. **Planning and Development: Bill Fischer**
- City approved house plans for house on 27 Ave SW which had been built incorrectly
 - City approved old-car parking lot in Macleod Road and Mission Road for co-op
 - Concern about parking up 34 Ave
 - Concern about having a gas station there and propane
 - Comment: families moving because of Mission 34 complex, 34 Ave is lost as single-family dwellings. Troubled about how the future will look with those buildings
- v. **Traffic: Rob Lukacs**
- Wants to do a survey monkey on speeding limits and other traffic issues
 - Macleod/25 Ave study still just a study for now
 - Traffic issues through Erlton
 - Different options for installing speed bumps – pilot may work
 - Approval for rubber instead of asphalt
 - Different costs depending on materials
 - Eric Peters from City (Ward 9)
 - Place that they've found pushback is Calgary Fire who don't like speed bumps
 - Acadia have started experimenting with bike lanes
 - Could ask if there are any ideas to try out
 - Division – “liveable streets”
 - Board member: waiting for report from Mac Logan, maybe Eric could touch base
 - Comment: could have a speed limit sign
 - Comment: needs to be an enforcement for it to work

4. Guest Speaker: Iris Li

Neighbourhood Partnership coordinator – City of Calgary

- City's public art program
- Can help with communication plans to make the Board stronger

5. Ongoing business

- a) Jane's walk met as a committee – planning for that has started
- b) Community Objectives Workshop (COW) – came up with a bunch of issues
 - Getting sections of building plans that we don't get info about
 - 2 other communities agreed
 - Eric Peters – COW workshop
 - Have started working on priority 1 – 2 items
 - Will let us know what's complete in coming months
 - Bylaw checklist is on next agenda with Gian-Carlo
 - Will bring up at coming meetings

6. New business

- a) Discussion about adding stations to C-train line
 - Comment: Is it really better to have more stops? Will eventually get slower
 Eric Peters from Gian-Carlo's office:
 - Red Line:
 - Discussion and scoping about what makes sense
 - Where's the demand and where would it be beneficial
 - Businesses on 50th Ave have been asking for more transit for their workers

- Property assessments:
 - Hope to have more information on that
 - Notice of motion:
 - Have childcare options on all City-owned building
 - May 3-5:
 - Elbow River flood information
 - New park strategists asking for concerns that you have about parks
 - Encampments:
 - Discussions on why it's taking so long to break these up?
 - Joint task force of police, fire, alpha house etc.
 - Try to assess people and get help they need
 - Report and recommendation as to how that can be funded
- b) CEO of Central library (Bill):
- Cathy – contact for community associations
 - Cathy.Freer-Leszczynski@calgarypubliclibrary.com
 - Library cards to hand out – they're free
 - So important for early literacy
 - Get as many people connected to the library as possible
 - All meeting rooms for community groups are FREE! Librarymeeting.ca
 - Programs about things on at the library
 - Memorial library
 - First library in Alberta
 - Used as much as it ever was
 - Community developing around it is changing
 - More urban families, younger people
 - How to make it respond more to community?
 - Want to talk to community to get a sense of what you'd like to see
 - How do we tie in the parks – concerts etc.
 - Shakespeare in park? Jazz nights? Movies?
 - If you want to help out with library discussions – where Memorial library should go from here, contact Cathy at email above.
