<b>Community Engagement Report Back</b>	<p>The City of Calgary is pleased that 43 CAs participated in two sessions held in November 2016 to provide input on how The City could better support community associations. For those of you who are new to the program, **READYCALGARY** is a community preparedness program developed by the Calgary Emergency Management Agency (CEMA) for the citizens of Calgary. It has been designed to inform, educate and build resiliency to the impacts of emergencies and disasters (an all-hazards approach). The information contained in this course will help to encourage safety at home, in the workplace, neighbourhood and community.

We will be holding training this spring and as a vital link to the community, we hope you can help us get the word out:

- **May 16<sup>th</sup>**: *Section 1* - This section covers the fundamentals of emergency management particularly significant for individuals and families.
- **May 23<sup>rd</sup>**: *Section 2* - Further develops on the material in Section 1 to reflect the needs and requirements of a whole community. This section is more advanced and intended for individuals interested in helping support their neighbourhood and community.
