City of Calgary – Single Use Item Bylaw in Effect on January 16, 2024.



More than 15,000,000 single use items are disposed of weekly by recycling, composting or trash in Calgary. Single use items are items that are used once and then discarded. Plastic shopping bags, takeout utensils, straws and napkins are examples of items that the bylaw is intended to address. This goal is to reduce use of these items by encouraging Calgarian's to choose reusable options as often as possible.

The bylaw doesn't apply to pet waste bags, bags that were returned to a business for re-use or small paper bags that are 400 square cm or less. Primary packaging used on items (bakery goods, meat and poultry, pharmacy, take-out food wrapping, frozen foods etc.) is also excluded. Registered charities are exempt while providing charitable service.

Starting on January 16, 2024 Calgary businesses will be required to:

- Provide shopping bags by request only
- Charge a minimum fee of \$.15 cents for a new single use shopping bag.
- Charge a minimum fee of \$1.00 for a new reusable shopping bag.
- Provide food ware accessories by request only.

Calgarians will need a reusable bag for shopping and will be required to specify necessary food ware accessories when dining in, taking out or ordering food online.

Calgary's Short Term Rental Study. (submitted by City of Calgary).

The City of Calgary and the University of Calgary (UCalgary) researchers are launching the first phase of a two part public engagement on short term rentals (STRs). This initiative is one compound of a multi-year research collaboration between the City of Calgary and UCalgary aimed at developing an evidence-based policy framework for STRs, adaptable to market conditions.

Calgarians are encouraged to complete an online survey to share insights about how and why they participate in the STR market, how STRs impact communities and what they see as current and future concerns.

Administration and UCalgary are expected to deliver a final report and recommendations to Council in Dec.2024. Participation in this study will provide important information and insight to the UCalgary research team regarding the dynamics and nuances of Calgary's short term rental market, its impacts, its challenges and potential.


