2024 is the Erlton Community Association's 45th Anniversary

The Erlton Community Association was registered with the Province of Alberta on November 14 1979, our first set of bylaws were written and approved by the Board of Directors at that time. Our bylaws were updated in 2014 and we are planning to review them again in 2024.

Our Vision and Mission Statements are available on our website. These statements reflect our Association's commitment to our present goals and future direction of our community.

Vision Statement: Erlton is Calgary's best kept secret and an innercity gem. As one of the City's founding neighborhoods, Erlton Strives to be a life-style friendly and safe community where quality development is balanced with respect for our neighbors, historic character and the natural environment.

Mission Statement: The ECA strives to represent the interests of our residents with the aim of developing a strong and vibrant community.

Our 2024 Board of Directors are volunteers who fill the roles of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Planning and Development, Parks, Traffic, Membership, Communications and Social Events. We are also very fortunate to have a Cemetary sub-committee volunteer. We work really hard to stay connected with our members and look for opportunites to welcome new residents to our community.

As we don't have a community facility to get together, we have been using our outdoor spaces for events. The Erlton Garden has been a great place for neighbors to meet neighbors and learn new gardening tips. There is a fire pit in the garden that we have been using for community bonfire events and these are becoming more popular each time. Unfortunately we keep losing our firewood

supply and would appreciate any wood that could be donated to us. The next bonfire is set for March 22^{nd} .

The 2024 Neighbor Day party will be held at Erlton Park again. One of our goals is to continue to make improvements to our community parks to create more outdoor gathering spaces for everyone to enjoy.

We received a grant to hire local artist Schux of Schux Design to paint a mural in Lindsay Park, we'll be asking for feedback from our members for potential design options.

Our membership sales are our primary source of revenue to meet our commitments and fund our events. So far, our 2024 membership sales are lower than previous years and this is concerning to our board. Fees are \$10.00 per household, Seniors are exempt from the fee. LINDSAY'S ESTATE - A HISTORY OF PARKVIEW AND ERLTON

The ECA received a grant from the Alberta Historical Resources Foundation in 2001. These funds were used to hire historian David Mittelstadt to research our community history dating back to early 1900's and publish a book of his findings for all of us to enjoy.

Mr. Mittelstadt dug into the Glenbow, City of Calgary and Canadian archives, interviewed residents and consulted with the Board of Directors to ensure his information was accurate. The result of his research is:

Lindsay's Estate: A History of Parkview and Erlton

This book contains a very interesting and detailed history of our community from the early 1900's to the 1980's. It includes descriptions of significant events, businesses, photos, maps, drawings, and biographies of people and families who played significant roles in the history and development of our community from the early 1900's to 1980's.

pid You Know? Erlton Commmunity was originally split into 2 separate communities called Earlton and Parkview?

YUP! —The property was owned by Dr. Lindsay, he subdivided some of the property in 1906 and called the area Parkview, and subdivided again in 1910 as Earlton, eventually Erlton .The names were kept separate until the 1970's but formed one district, now known as Erlton South and Erlton North .

"Parkview became part of Calgary in 1907, lots were sold for \$100.00 - \$300.00. Erlton became part of Calgary in 1910 and lots were initially starting sale for \$350.00" (Lindsay's Estate: A History of Parkview and Erlton).

Real Estate Advertisement: "Erlton. This beautiful sub-division on the market for the first time. These lots command a splendid view of the city and adjoin the Lindsay Estate, being one mile from the Post Office and on the proposed car line...Positively your last opportunity to buy view lots within this radius for even double the price" 100 lots were available at starting price of \$350.00. (Lindsay's Estate:A History of Parkview and Erlton)



Calgary River Valleys Project – Engagement Information:

The City of Calgary is planning for the future of our river valleys, including our flood hazard areas, through the **Calgary River Valleys Project.** The Calgary River Valley Project has launched Stage 2 engagement, we will look at floodplain policy and land use decisions, with a focus on location-specific regulations and flood mapping.

Calgary's draft updated Flood Hazard Area map will be an important tool to help guide engagement conversations, the map reflects the latest understanding of a 1:100 (1 per cent chance) flood risk and includes a new approach to flood hazard area mapping. Mission Bridge Rehabilitation Project <u>Calgary.ca/MissionBridgeRehab</u> [calgary.ca].

"The Mission Bridge rehabilitation project will begin in Spring 2024. The work involved will be repairing various bridge components (railing, approach slabs, piers, and abutments). The anticipated repairs will mainly address the concrete deterioration across the structure and will also give us an opportunity to redesign the bridge cross-section and improve mobility for pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists."

"The main objectives of the project are to extend the bridge service life by 35 years, and to improve the overall mobility for pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists. We are so pleased that the Calgary Dream Centre will be building brand new affordable housing for single women, single women with children, seniors and people with disabilities at the site of the Erlton School.






